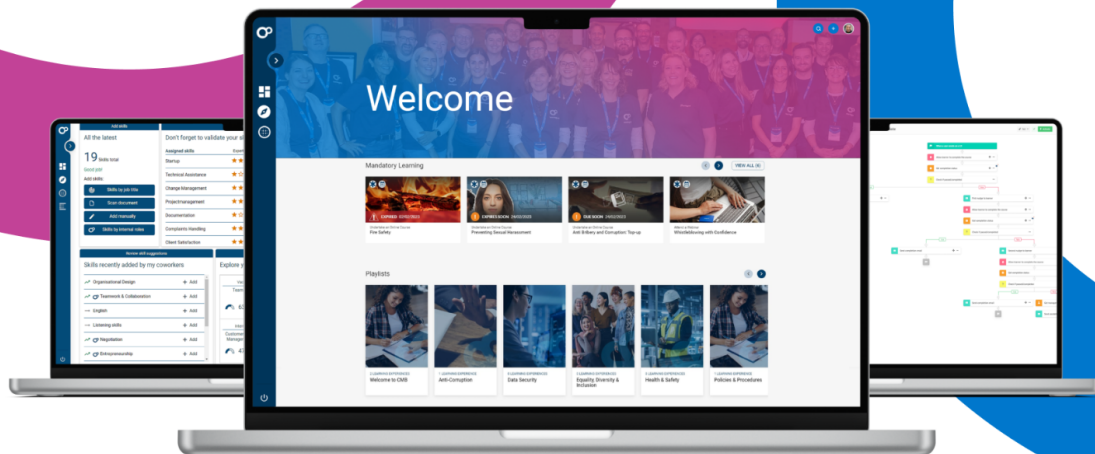

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Introduction

We are delighted to announce the upcoming launch of our new, fully integrated Assessments functionality within the Learning Platform (LXP). This will allow the authoring and management of assessments directly within the Learning Platform, removing the need for any external applications.

Packed with lots of exciting features, this new capability is designed to help you to effectively measure knowledge, ensure compliance, and gain valuable insights into learner comprehension and skills gap analysis, all from a single, intuitive interface directly in the platform.

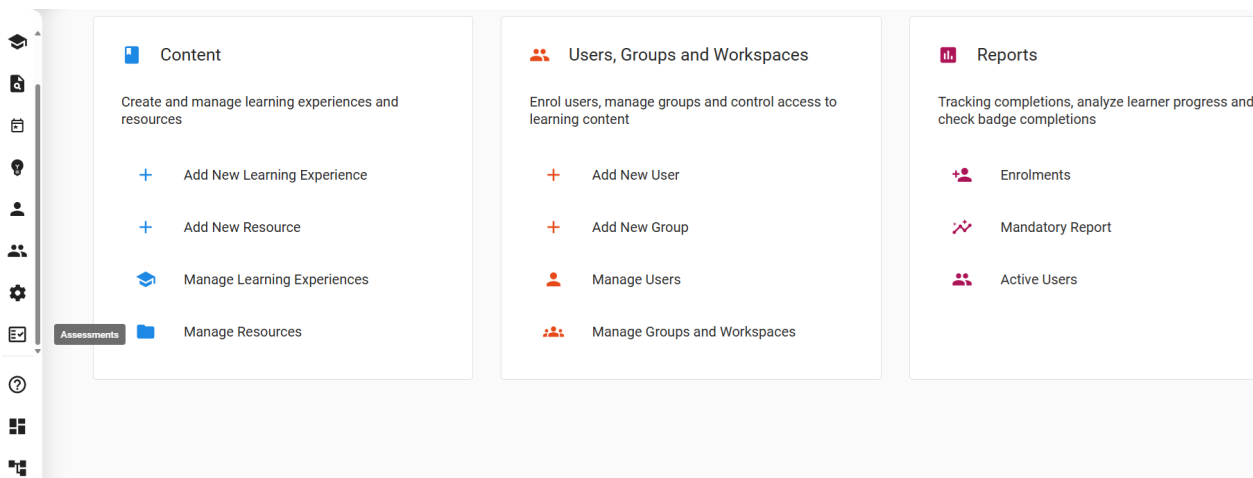
Core Terminology

The following terminology is key to understanding how Assessments work:

- **Assessments** are the overarching container. They appear as resources in the platform and can be used in learning experiences in the same way as any other resource.
- **Questions:** the individual test or quiz items that live within an Assessment.
- **Question Bank:** a library of previously created questions inside the Assessments,

Admin Access to Assessments

Learning Platform Org Admins have full admin access with the ability to create and manage all assessments and questions within the organisation. In order for organisations to use Assessments, the Org Admin will have to switch on the Modern UI. Once this has been done, Org Admins can click the 'Assessments' icon located in the vertical navigation menu. This is the central space for creating and managing all assessments and questions. Custom roles can also be created for users to access Assessments at Org Level. Customers can request this by contacting Learning Pool support.



Assessment Creation

The following screenshot shows how an assessment is created and the following information can be populated:

- General Information
 - Name
 - Alias
 - Description
 - External Reference
- Randomisation (show questions in a different order per learner attempt)
- Passing Criteria (this is configurable as percentage but will then also indicate the specific number of questions required to pass)
- Attempts (set the number of attempts or retakes allowed)
- Results (show learners' correct answers)

Once created, assessments can be added to any object within any Learning Experience from the resource library.

As per the above screenshot, questions can be created by clicking the 'Create Question' button or adding previously created questions by clicking the 'Add Questions from Bank' button. This is where the Question Bank resides.

Assessment and Question Management

All assessment management is centralised within the dedicated Assessments admin area, providing a single point of control for editing, duplicating and deletion.

Clicking on the dots on the right hand side of an assessment row allows Admins to edit, duplicate or delete an assessment.

Edit

Any edits made to an assessment will automatically sync with the resource wherever it is used. To help prevent any unintended edit or where learners are currently sitting an assessment, Admins will see the following message displayed:

To help prevent accidental loss of assessments for learners, a confirmation warning appears when attempting to delete an assessment. This advises Admins that where the assessment is currently in use,

proceeding to delete will also remove it from the Resource library and any learning experiences it is a part of. To perform a delete, click on the three dots on an assessment row and click 'Delete'. If the assessment has not been taken or is being undertaken then it can be deleted and will not be visible in the Assessment Admin area. If however the assessment is in use then the user will see the following message:

- All questions remain in your Question Bank
- Historical learner data is preserved in reports

Duplicate

Assessments can be duplicated to create new variants. The questions that are assigned to the original assessment can also be pulled into the new assessment if desired.

Again historical records will be preserved for learners who have already submitted an assessment. The same logic for editing, deleting and duplicating questions applies in the Question Bank.

Assessment Scoring

Passing an assessment is based on the learner achieving the required pass score set in the Create Assessment page. For multiple-choice questions with multiple correct answers, the learner must select all the correct options to pass; partial selections are marked as a fail.

Assessment Object completion

Passing or simply submitting an assessment are options for assessment completion. Admins need to navigate to the Learning Experience, Manage Content and select the object. Now in the 'Game Settings' set the 'Completion Type' to 'Submission' or 'Passed' in order for the learner to gain the XP.

- Submission (Default - the object completes upon any submission)
- Passed (object only completes if the learner's score is greater than or equal to the Pass Score)

The learner will be informed they have to pass or only submit when about to sit the assessment.

Admin In-platform Reporting

Admins have two core reports available to them:

- **Assessment Overview Report:** Shows all assessments and the number of questions, pass score, overall pass rate, total attempts, passes, and fails for each assessment.
- **Attempts Report:** Shows all user completions and the status (e.g., completed, in progress), score, and pass/fail result for each assessment attempt.

Learner access to Assessments

Learners can access an individual assessment in an Learning Experience in the same way as they can with other resources. This can be the LX as a whole, or within a level of the Learning Experience. On selecting a level they will see the assessments within that level and how many XPs are attributed to the assessments.

On selecting an individual assessment the learner will see:

- Assessment name
- Assessment description
- Number of questions
- Pass score

They will also be able to see any previous comments by learners who have previously undertaken the assessment or add their own if comments have been enabled at Org Level.

Learner Undertaking and Submitting Assessment

At this stage the learner will also see the questions associated with the assessment. They will then have to answer all of the questions before they can submit. On answering each question their response will be automatically saved. This functionality has been created in case the learner does not have time to complete the assessment, loses online signal or simply does not want to submit their answers at that particular time. If they do not or are unable to submit their assessment they can resume from the first unanswered question.

Once a learner has submitted their assessment by clicking the 'Submit Assessment' button they will immediately be informed of their result. They will see:

- Pass or Fail
- Their score
- Number of questions answered correctly
- Time spent on the assessment

If the Org Admin has allowed retakes and the learner has not reached the retake threshold, they are immediately given the option to retake the assessment. Alternatively, they could resit the assessment at a time of their convenience.

Future Enhancements

Based on initial feedback, these are the high-priority enhancements we are looking to introduce in the next development cycles:

- Tagging and filtering of individual questions and assessments for easier question management
- Question Admin Report: Shows all questions, the success rate per question, the number of times attempted, and the most common incorrect answers for each. Useful to identify problematic questions.
- Adding images and videos to questions to provide greater question context
